Mission and Key goals of Organization: Youth Speaks, Inc. creates safe spaces to empower the next generation of leaders, self-defined artists, and visionary activists through written and oral literacies. We challenge youth to find, develop, publicly present, and apply their voices as creators of social change. Ultimately, we hope to shift the perceptions of youth by combating illiteracy, alienation, and silence, creating a global movement of brave new voices bringing the noise from the margins to the core.

Required skills, knowledge and experience: In addition to possessing the administrative and communication skills necessary to play a role in assisting the execution of Youth Speaks' Bay Area programs with our myriad partners and staff, ample skills and experience in the following is desired: Youth development, Arts education, Evaluation, Program support, Leadership, being an Educator, being a Youth mentor, being an Organizer, art practitioner.

The Intern should be highly competent with the Google interface since we primarily use Google Drive and its programs. If the Intern has experience in Adobe Illustrator, Photoshop and/or Graphic design skills, this will be valuable, as we always need administrative concepts graphically represented.

Preferred Work Schedule:

- Day 1: Tuesday anytime between 11am-6pm (for 5 hours)
- Day 2: Wednesday OR Thursday anytime between 11am-6pm (for 5 hours), alternating with every other Friday 4:30-9:30pm
- Note: We have all-staff meetings/trainings every other Tuesday between 1-3pm and Bay Area Staff meetings the 4th Tuesday of every month from 3:30-5:30pm.



Work Site Location: The Bay Area Program Extern will report to our offices at 1663 Mission St. in San Francisco. There will be opportunities for the Extern to accompany in site visits to 5 High Schools in Oakland and 4 High Schools in San Francisco where we have HS Residencies. There are also two Under 21 Open Mics every month, 1 in Oakland and the other in San Francisco that the Intern will be required to assist in managing as an adult liaison and ultimately a production lead (includes training).

Orientation and/or trainings we will provide/require for the Bay Area Intern:

- Bi-monthly all-staff meetings will include organization-wide trainings.
- Monthly trainings with SPOKES (our Youth Advisory Board) will include trainings on: Event planning, Under 21 Open Mic facilitation, Slam Clubs, Unified District Poetry Slam event management, Teen Poetry Slam event management, personal artistic development, etc.
- Production management trainings facilitated by our Production Manager, Kat Evasco.
